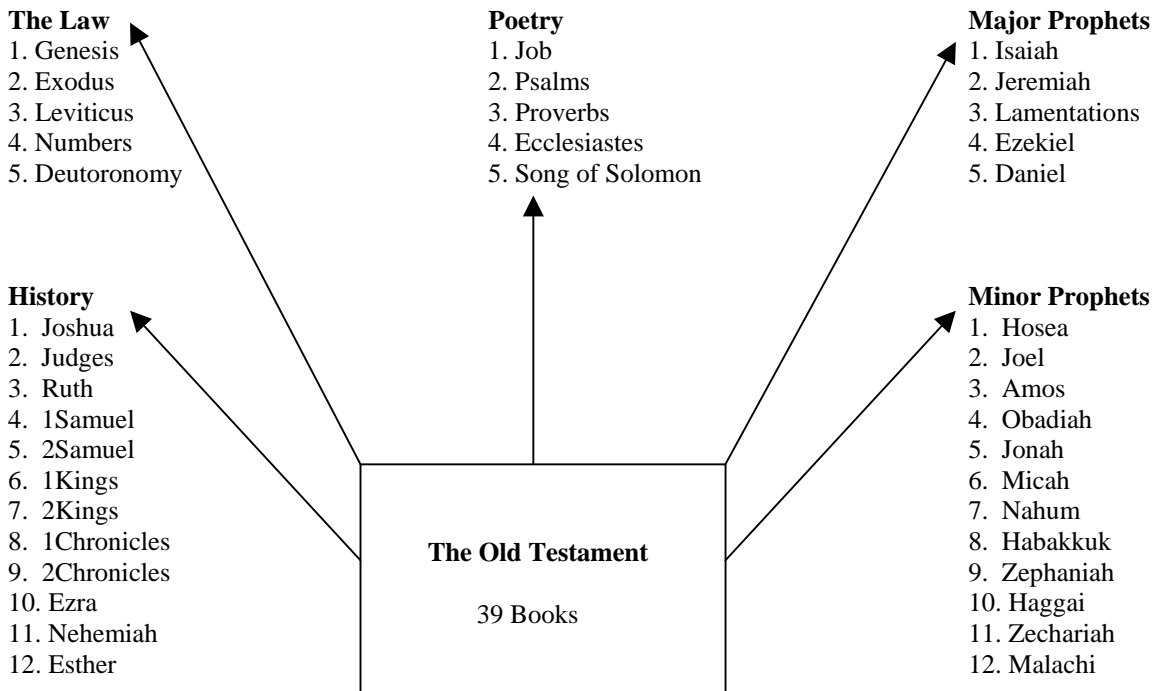

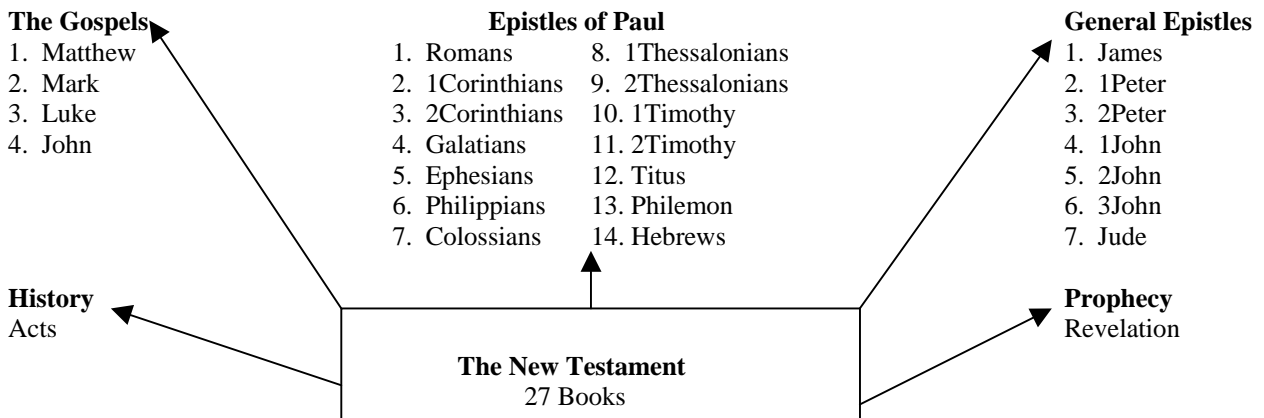

How Bible References are Written

We usually abbreviate Bible references in the following manner:

1Cor 5:17 means the First Letter to the Corinthians, chapter 5, verse 17.

These chapter and verse numbers are not part of the original text. They have been added by translators as an aid for quick reference. Generally there is a basic thought pattern, chapter by chapter. However in some places the flow of thought is interrupted by a chapter or verse break. (E.g. *1Cor 12:31 and 1Cor 13:1*) Usually each Bible has some way of indicating paragraph breaks.

Words in Italics

Words in Italics in the King James' Version were not in the original Hebrew or Greek text, but have been put there by translators to help express the meaning of the passage concerned.
